Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

- When does the 2024-2025 HEAP program open?
 - Applications for the 2024-2025 HEAP Regular benefit will be accepted starting
 November 1, 2024, and remain open through close of business (COB) March 17,
 2025, or until funding allocated to this component is exhausted; whichever comes first.
 - The 2024 -2025 Emergency benefit will open on January 2, 2025, and remain open through COB March 17, 2025.
 - The 2024-2025 Heating Equipment Repair and Replacement (HERR) will open
 October 1, 2024, and remain open through COB September 30, 2025, or until funding allocated to this component is exhausted.
 - The 2024-2025 Clean and Tune benefits will open October 1, 2024, and remain open through COB September 30, 2025, or until funding allocated to this component is exhausted.
 - The 2024-2025 Cooling Assistance Component (CAC) will open on April 15, 2025, and remain open, through COB August 29, 2025, or until funding allocated to this component is exhausted; whichever comes first. Households containing a vulnerable member based on their age (60 years of age or older, or children under age 6) which meet all other component eligibility criteria may receive cooling assistance benefits without a corresponding medical need. All households without a vulnerable member based on their age must have a medical condition which is exacerbated by extreme heat and is verified in writing by a physician, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner. Households that are unable to obtain required documentation may attest to having a medical condition.

 the Department of Social Services receives your application, a HEAP worker will
 call you to complete in interview over the phone.
- At this time, all HEAP benefit applicants can utilize the phone interview option.
